PROM HOW TO: 5 WAYS TO PROM SUCCESS

It's the biggest night of your life (so far), and there's no doubt you want to make it the best night too. Here are our top five tips for making your prom unforgettable.

1 Month Before

- # Brainstorm pre- and post-prom activities with your friends and your date.
- # Make a restaurant reservation.
- # Stop by your local florist to actually pick out a corsage.
- # Talk to your parents about prom night curfew and plans, just so there are no surprises.

2 Weeks Before

- # Double-check your limo, dinner, and hotel reservations. You can never be too sure.
- # Get a haircut!
- # Pick out a new cologne that will make your date weak at the knees.

The Day Before

- # Call up your date to tell her how much you're looking forward to the big night.
- # Write down all the information you'll need for prom: phone and location for your date, your restaurant, the main event, and any post-prom plans.
- # Get a decent night's sleep.

The Day of the Prom

- # Pick up your date's corsage and stash it in the fridge.
- # Shave.
- # Clip and clean your nails.
- # Style your hair (but don't overload on hair products).
- # Pack up your prom essentials: breath mints, money, keys, cell phone, camera, prom tickets, corsage, and anything else you need.
- # You're all set!

PROM HOW TO: CHOOSE A CORSAGE

Not sure what the deal is when it comes to buying her a corsage? Don't worry. We've got easy answers to all of your questions.

What is a corsage? It's really quite simple: a corsage is a small arrangement of two or three flowers tied with a ribbon to match your date's dress. And it's a prom necessity -- don't even think about showing up at her home without it.

What kind should I get? There are three different types of corsages: pin-on corsages, wrist corsages, and small, handheld nosegays. These days, most girls prefer a wrist, as the pin type isn't exactly easy to stick to a strapless dress (and you don't want to play pin the flowers on your prom date, right?). If you're not sure, ask her -- but if you want to surprise her, stick with the wrist.

When do I get it? You'll want to go corsage shopping at least two weeks before the prom. Wait any longer and you may end up with slim pickings. Remember, this is one of your big chances to really impress your date, so don't wait until the last minute.

Which flowers should I pick? Roses and carnations are the usual suspects, but we love more modern flowers like calla lilies or orchids. Look for a corsage with two or three flowers: Any less will make it look sparse, any more

and she'll look like she's wearing a bouquet.

So that's it? Not quite. Next you'll need to pick out a ribbon for the corsage, which should match her dress. If you're planning to surprise your date, get the scoop on her dress' color from one of her friends. It doesn't have to match exactly, but it shouldn't clash either.

How much will I spend? A corsage can set you back anywhere from \$10 to \$75 -- and in some cases even more. It all depends on your personal budget and choice of flowers. But don't assume that more means better! You should definitely be able to find one that you like (and more importantly, that she'll like) that won't bust your prom budget.

PROM HOW TO: BOOK A LIMO

Unless your last name is Trump, it's not every day that you arrive at an event in a limousine. Here's a rundown of all of the things you need to think about if you want to pimp your ride to prom.

JUMP START Don't miss the boat ...er, make that car. Since limos are in high demand during prom season, plan to book yours early. Two to three months before prom should give you enough time to make the arrangements.

HOP IN Limos come in all shapes and sizes. Figure out exactly how many people will be in your group since that will determine the kind of limo you end up with. A basic rule of thumb is that a super-stretch limos will hold 10-12 passengers; for a standard stretch limo, 6 passengers is plenty.

GAS 'N' GO If you're gonna ride like a star, prepare to shell out some cash. Renting a limo for the evening will start at around \$400. You can keep the cost down by going with a group and splitting the expense. You'll also need to tip the driver, usually 15-20% of the total fare. Some companies will include the tip in the total charge, so make sure to ask in advance. And don't forget to comparison shop -- prices vary widely, so you should check around to find the best deal.

SPEEDBUMP You might be asked to make a deposit in advance. This is to cover any mishaps that may happen during the night -- like big messes in the car, blah blah blah. Just keep everything under control and you'll see that money again post-prom.

BUCKLE UP It's crucial to find out if the limousine service is licensed by the state. If not, you may get stuck with poor service, a shoddy limo, and a rude driver. Check references and your contract carefully. And get an after-hours phone number for someone at the company -- just in case you hit a few unexpected curves.

WORK THE ROOM

Prom's kind of like a weird Breakfast Club-style moment, with everyone coming together for one of the last fiestas of the school year, and anyone can talk to anyone. Capitalize on that, and you'll feel like the star of the show. After all, it's all about being confident -- not being cocky. So even if you've never talked to that girl from chem lab before, it's totally cool to compliment her on her dress if you're in line for the ladies' room together. Or if your date's talking to someone at one of the tables, head on over there and strike up a convo with someone else. If your interest is genuine, your smiles will be too -- and it'll be easy to see that you're all that, even from across the room.

GET FAB PHOTOS

Sure, you'll get tons of great candid photos with all of your friends, but it's your professional, "official" prom photos that'll really help you remember the dance (and that your mom will be whipping out for years to come). Fortunately for you, rescuing them from utter cheesiness is easy -- just pose like a pro, instead of like a suspect in a police lineup. Stand up straight (that's right, shoulders back, ladies!) and place one of your legs in front of the other. Then put your weight on the leg that's in back (you'll wind up with your shoulders facing toward the camera and your hips tilted away from it -- super slimming). P.S.: Don't forget to smile!

HANG LOOSE

A totally confident prom babe can get out there and shake it on the dance floor without touching her hair every two seconds to check that it's still in place. (And trying to spot stray strands in the mirrored ceiling? Also a faux pas.) Break the habit by choosing a prom hairstyle that can last as long as you out there on the floor. The undone, almost messy updos that are huge this year look even better once you've been shaking your groove thing, and bedhead-style hair that's left down actually looks better the less you tend to it. If you simply must have a sleek style, make sure you've got it well secured (you don't have to douse yourself with hairspray -- we're just talking a few extra pins here!) and leave your hands free for running through his hair.

DANCE, DANCE, DANCE

Are your dance moves not quite ready for prime time? Don't worry. You don't have to be leading the crowd in a choreographed routine to bust a move. Head over to the DJ and request a song that you love, then grab the girls and hit the floor. The time out will help you focus, and keep you from engaging in less-than-appealing drunken antics (remember Julia Stiles in *10 Things I Hate About You*? Exactly!).

JUST KISS!

The lights are low, the DJ's playing your song, and you're so ready for him to plant one on you. He's probably thinking the same thing (minus the readiness part), so use our foolproof plan to give him the nudge he needs. Catch his eye and hold his gaze for a second, then look down toward his lips (a little smile never hurt either). This should make a light bulb go off in his head, letting him know that now is indeed the right time. He won't be able to keep his lips away from yours a moment longer.

basis for most other yoga and meditation poses, and even though doing it properly takes a lot of practice (and a lot of flexibility) after a few tries you should be able to work up to it. Sit on the floor with your legs stretched out in front of you. Bend your right knee and gently place your right foot on your left knee (or as close to your body as possible). Now bend your left knee and place your left foot on your right knee. (See what we mean about flexibility? If you feel uncomfortable, keep one foot on the ground.) Now place your wrists on your knees, palms facing up. Relax your wrists and fingers -- if you want to really do it right, touch your middle fingers with your thumbs. Absolute Dream Limousines, Inc, its employees, or contractors are not responsible for any articles left in the vehicle, at ANY time. There are no refunds for unused time.

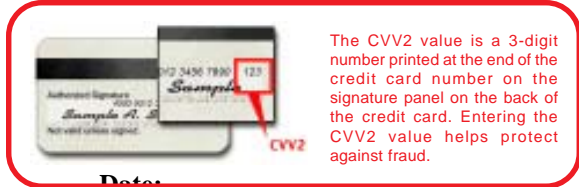
